The South Monmouth Municipal Utilities Authority members met in the Wall Township Municipal Building Meeting Room on August 4, 2011. Present were Chairman Bryan Dempsey representing the Borough of Spring Lake, Vice Chairman Kevin Thompson representing the Borough of Sea Girt, Thomas Nolan representing the Borough of Brielle, Art Herner representing the Borough of Spring Lake Heights and Executive Director Joseph Verruni representing Wall Township. Also present were attorney Mark Kitrick, attorney John Cantalupo, CFO Steve Mayer and NJWSA Manager Rich Famularo. Wall Township Assistant Administrator Kate Kohri was also present.

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Dempsey.

Chairman Dempsey called for a moment of silence followed by the Salute to the Flag.
