Beth Gates spoke about required treatment of the invasive hydrilla plant that has been discovered in the Manasquan Reservoir. The plant must be controlled as it is an invasive plant that can clog water intakes, impair water quality, impact habitat for fish, waterfowl and other wildlife within the Reservoir and wetlands. The Authority will initiate an herbicide application to manage the hydrilla infestation at the Reservoir Boat Launch beginning on May 15th, with one application a month through September. Herbicide application signs will be posted at the launch site and on the Authority's hydrilla webpage. Permits have been obtained from NJDEP.

There being no further old or new business, Bryan Dempsey called for a motion to adjourn. Jeffry Bertrand made a motion to adjourn, was seconded by Lorraine Carafa and all being in agreement, the meeting adjourned at 9:52 AM.
