RESOLUTION OF THE SOUTHEAST MONMOUTH MUNICIPAL UTILITIES AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING A RENEWAL & REPLACEMENT & PURCHASE OF REDUNDANCY SYSTEM EQUIPMENT – TWO SIEMENS ULTRASONIC LEVEL METERS

WHEREAS, the Southeast Monmouth Municipal Utilities Authority (hereinafter referred to as the "Authority") serves the Township of Wall, the Borough of Brielle, the Borough of Sea Girt, the Borough of Spring Lake and the Borough of Spring Lake Heights and is comprised of member municipalities which receive treated water from the Authority; and

WHEREAS, within the operating budget of the Southeast Monmouth Municipal Utilities Authority funds have been reserved within the Renewal and Replacement Reserve Account for the renewal and replacement of equipment for the Water Treatment Plant located on Hospital Road in Wall, NJ; and

WHEREAS, the New Jersey Water Supply Authority's operations and maintenance staff recently identified the need for an immediate purchase of two Siemens Ultrasonic Level meters at the Manasquan Water Treatment Plant; and

WHEREAS, the total cost for the purchase for redundancy control cards, hardware and software for redundancy system equipment at the Manasquan Water Treatment Plant is in the amount of \$3,358.00; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Southeast Monmouth Municipal Utilities Authority that it hereby authorizes the New Jersey Water Supply Authority to proceed with the use of funds from the renewal and replacement reserve for the purchase of two Siemens Ultrasonic Level Meters at the Manasquan Water Treatment Plant for an amount of \$3,358.00 to cover the cost of this expense.
